## **Description/Remarks**

This is a 2-story, 5-bay domestic building in the Georgian style with Colonial Revival influences built in 1924. The structural system is balloon frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original wood siding and original wood siding. The building has a high side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are original wood, 6/1 double-hung sashes. There is a three-bay veranda characterized by a shed roof clad in asphalt shingles with square wood posts on square wood piers. Almost full front balcony porch with square columns and classical cap, turned ballustrade. Double side gabled roof gives the appearance of an I House at first glance.
