Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 3-bay domestic building in the No Primary Style with Folk/Traditional influences built in 1890. The structural system is undetermined. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a medium side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with flush eaves. There is an enclosed porch characterized by a shed roof clad in asphalt shingles. Original shed style front porch has been enclosed for additional living space using board and batten siding. There are two small additions on the rear, forming a "U" Shaped dwelling. This was most likely a small saddlebag or hall/parlor type house. There is the possibility of restoration.
