Description/Remarks

This is a 2-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Prairie School style built in 1921. The structural system is balloon frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original stucco. The building has a low hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles and one clipped gable dormer. Windows are original wood, 9/1 double-hung sashes. There is a full-span veranda characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with square stuccoed posts on square concrete block piers.
