Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 4-bay domestic building in the Tudor style with Mission/Spanish Revival influences built in 1931. The structural system is balloon frame. The foundation is piers. Exterior walls are original brick. The building has a cross gable roof clad in original asbestos shingle , eave brackets. There is one off center in front, exterior, brick chimney. Windows are replacement vinyl, 6/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, single-bay central portico characterized by a gable with arch roof clad in asbestos shingle with arched brick posts. A good example of the 1930-1950 eclectic revival styles available through pattern books and kit homes.
