Description/Remarks

This is a 1.5-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Craftsman style built in 1920. The structural system is frame. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a medium side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with open cornice , exposed rafters and brackets and one gabled dormer. Windows are original wood, multi/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof with square wood posts on square brick piers.
