Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Late Victorian style with Folk/Traditional influences built in 1900. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a low side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with box cornice. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by a shed roof clad in asphalt shingles with square wood posts.
