Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Colonial Revival style with Folk/Traditional influences built in 1923/1926. The structural system is frame. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a high side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are , multi-light fixed. There is a single-story, single-bay platform/stoop characterized by a shed roof clad in asphalt shingles with square wood posts. Parts of the roofing material in the rear are still the original asbestos tile.
