Description/Remarks

This is a 2-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Prairie School style built in 1921. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original brick. The building has a low hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are , vertical 5/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with short battered brick posts on square brick piers.
