Description/Remarks

This is a 1.5-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Eclectic style with Craftsman influences built in 1920. The structural system is undetermined. Exterior walls are original wood siding and original metal. The building has a cross gable roof clad in replacement standing seam metal. Windows are replacement vinyl, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a full-span open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof clad in standing seam metal with decorative wood posts on square brick piers. Second story an early addition. Porch added in 1925.
