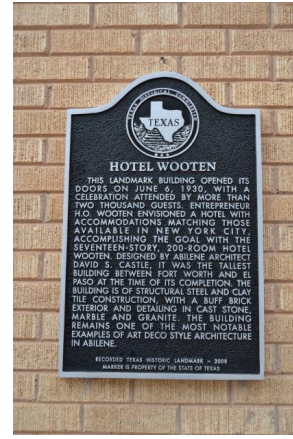

Description/Remarks

This is a 17-story, 13-bay commercial building in the Gothic/Neo-Gothic style with Art Deco influences built in 1930. The structural system is steel frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original limestone and original brick. The building has a flat with parapet roof. Windows are original wood, 9/9 double-hung sashes. This building is still the tallest structure in Old Town Abilene North and can be seen from miles away.
