This is a 2-story, 4-bay domestic building in the Colonial Revival style with Greek Revival influences built in 1903. The structural system is frame. The foundation is piers. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a hip and gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with box cornice, brackets. There are one offset left, straddle ridge, brick chimney and two offset right, straddle ridge, brick chimneys. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a two-story, single-bay open porch characterized by a gabled roof clad in asphalt shingles with classical wood posts. This house has been dilligently stabilized.
