## Description/Remarks

This is a 2-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Late Victorian style with Folk/Traditional influences built in 1910. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a high hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with box cornice. There is one center, straddle ridge, brick chimney. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, corner wrap-around open porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with classical wood posts. The stone two story apartment building in the rear was used to house soldiers during the Camp Barkeley days.
