Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 5-bay domestic building in the Classical Revival style with Colonial Revival influences built in 1925. Exterior walls are original wood siding. The building has a clipped hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles and one shed-roofed dormer. Windows are , multi-light casements. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof clad in asphalt shingles with classical wood posts. A nice mixture of Italianate details, Classical Revival, and Colonial styles.
