Description/Remarks

This is a 1.5-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Folk/Traditional style with Eastlake/Folk Victorian influences built in 1905. The structural system is frame. The foundation is piers. Exterior walls are original wood siding. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, two-bay open porch characterized by a hip roof clad in asphalt shingles with modern turned wood posts.
