**Description/Remarks**

This is a 1.5-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Late Victorian style with Queen Anne influences built in 1900. The structural system is balloon frame. The foundation is piers. Exterior walls are original wood siding and original wood shingles. The building has a hip and gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, two-bay open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof with turned wood posts on square wood piers. What started out as a two room front gable house has been historically modified to be a 1-1/2 story Folk Victorian with sedate Queen Anne detailing. It has remained unaltered in form since 1917. This house has been identified as one of the 12 remaining resources for Old Town Abilene of the turn of the 20th century era.
