**Description/Remarks**

This is a 1.5-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Eclectic style with Eastlake/Folk Victorian influences built in 1920. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original brick and original wood siding. The building has a bellcast hip roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with raked box cornice and two bellcast hipped dormers. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof with round wood posts on square brick piers.
