Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Craftsman style with Mission/Spanish Revival influences built in 1929. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original brick. The building has a low hip roof clad in original terra cotta barrel tile with box cornice and one hip-roofed dormer. There are one side right, exterior, brick chimney and two offset left, straddle ridge, brick chimneys. Windows are original wood, 1/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, full-span open porch characterized by an integrated (under the main) roof clad in terra-cotta tiles with square brick posts.
