Description/Remarks

This is a 1.5-story, 4-bay domestic building in the Tudor style with English Cottage Revival influences built in 1941. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original brick. The building has a high side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with flush eaves and one shed-roofed dormer. There is one off center in front, exterior, brick chimney. Windows are original wood, multi-light casements. There is a single-story, recessed umbrage characterized by a shed roof clad in asphalt shingles with arched wood posts.
