**Description/Remarks**

This is a 2-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Georgian style with Federal influences built in 1941. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original stone veneer. The building has a high side gable roof clad in replacement asphalt shingles with flush eaves. There are one side left, exterior, stone chimney and two side right, exterior, stone chimneys. Windows are original wood, 8/8 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, single-bay platform/stoop characterized by a gabled roof clad in asphalt shingles with fluted wood posts.
