Description/Remarks

This is a 1-story, 3-bay domestic building in the Eclectic style with Mission/Spanish Revival influences built in 1925. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are original brick. The building has a multi-plane/complex roof clad in original terra cotta barrel tile with flush eaves. Windows are original wood, multi-light arched casement. There is a platform/stoop. Front tower with terra cotta tiles serves as the main entry.
