Description/Remarks

This is a 2-story, 5-bay domestic building in the Mission/Spanish Revival style with Eclectic influences built in 1908. The structural system is frame. The foundation is undetermined. Exterior walls are replacement brick. The building has a low hip roof clad in replacement terra cotta barrell tile with raked box cornice, eave brackets and one hip-roofed dormer. There is one side left, rear slope, brick chimney. Windows are replacement wood, 6/1 double-hung sashes. There is a single-story, single-bay central open porch characterized by a flat with balcony roof clad in terra-cotta tiles with square brick posts. A complete (historic) over-haul was made to this property in 1928, turining it into the grand Ecclectic home you see today.
